What is Thanksgiving?

Thanksgiving is celebrated on the fourth Thursday of November each year in the United States and Canada. As the name suggests, it is a day for being thankful and is usually celebrated amongst family and friends



Why is Thanksgiving celebrated?

Originally, Thanksgiving was a festival to celebrate the harvest and thank God for the food that had been grown. It was started by the Pilgrims, who were religious travellers who had sailed to America from Europe in their ship, the Mayflower. After a failed first harvest, they celebrated their first successful harvest in the autumn of 1621 and hosted a huge feast to give thanks, both for the food and to the Native Americans who had helped them. It didn't become an official holiday until over 200 years later, in 1863.



How is Thanksgiving celebrated?

Today, Thanksgiving is a national holiday in the US. Many people travel to spend time with their family and friends, sharing feasts and enjoying each other's company. Although the first Thanksgiving meal likely included fish and deer, the modern Thanksgiving meal of choice is turkey served with potatoes and stuffing. There are many interesting Thanksgiving treats, such as pumpkin pie and sweet potato topped with marshmallows. On the day of Thanksgiving, the world's largest parade is held in New York City.

South Dakota (near Keystone in the Black Hills)
Construction started: October 4, 1927. Completed October 31, 1941.



Straddles the border of eastern California and western Nevada, about 135 miles northwest of Las Vegas, NV. Badwater Basin's salt flats is North America's lowest point at 282 feet below sea level. It is also North America's driest area with annual rainfall averages only 1.92 inches. Area: about 5,262 square miles.



In Yellowstone National Park, northwest corner of Wyoming. Eruptions can shoot 3,700 to 8,400 gallons of boiling water to a height of 106 to 185 feet lasting from 1 1/2 to 5 minutes. The average height of an eruption is 145 feet. Intervals between eruptions can range from 35 to 120 minutes, averaging 66.5 minutes.



Seattle, Washington. 605 feet observation tower. Built for the 1962 World's Fair. Construction started: April 17, 1961. It has a restaurant at 500' and an observation deck at 520'. Design is a compromise of the ideas of two architects: Edward E. Carlson and John Graham, Jr.







What is Canada Day?

Canada Day is a national holiday that celebrates Canada's confederation. It takes place on July 1st each year.

It celebrates the anniversary of the British North America Act, 1867, which united Nova Scotia, New Brunswick, and the Province of Canada (Quebec and Ontario) into a single country called Canada within the British Empire.



How do we celebrate Canada Day?

Canadians celebrate Canada Day in many different ways. Most commonly, Canadians will gather for large outdoor events such as barbecues, picnics, parades and concerts. The largest Canada Day celebration is held on the lawns of Parliament Hill in Ottawa, Ontario.



The History of Canada Day

Canada Day celebrates the anniversary of the British Parliament passing legislation called The British North America Act (now known as The Constitution Act) on July 1st, 1867.

Nova Scotia, New Brunswick, the province of Canada (Ontario and Quebec) formed this new Dominion of Canada.

Up until October 27, 1982, Canada Day was known as Dominion Day. It was changed to better reflect our independence from the British Empire.





Koala

Newborn koalas are called little ones, they are born blind and about the size of a jelly bean. After birth, the little one immediately crawls into the mother's pouch, where it remains for 6-7 months. At about 9-10 months of age, the joey finally leaves the pouch, ready to eat a variety of eucalyptus trees. The leaves of these trees are very toxic and have a low nutrient content, which requires a lot of energy to digest.

That's why koalas nap so much to conserve energy – often sleeping up to 18-20 hours a day!



Kangaroo

Tall and stocky, red kangaroos are the largest marsupial and largest Australian mammal, sometimes reaching over 6 feet tall.

Grey kangaroos live in the forests of Australia and Tasmania, while red kangaroos are found in the eucalyptus forests of the Northern Territory.

You'll find kangaroos in almost all Australian reserves and zoos, but seeing them in the wild is a real treat.




Wallaby

It can be quite difficult to tell a wallaby from a kangaroo. But it becomes quite easy when you see them side by side.

A wallaby is an almost exact miniature version of a kangaroo.

There are about 30 different species of wallaby, grouped by habitat: bush wallaby, bush wallaby and rock wallaby. You are likely to see wallabies hopping along the roads on the outskirts of major Australian cities.




New Zealand (Aotearoa) is an island country in the south Pacific Ocean. It is made up of two main islands, the North Island and the South Island which are separated by a body of water called the Cook Strait. New Zealand is one of the southernmost countries in the world. The highest peak is Mount Cook (Aoraki) which is approximately 3724 metres tall and is located on the South Island. The longest river is the Waikato which is on the North Island.

People that live in New Zealand have the nickname 'kiwis' and the majority of the population live on the North Island.

Waitangi Day, which takes place on 6th February each year, is the country's national day. In 1893, New Zealand became the first country to grant women the right to vote and it joined the Commonwealth in 1931.



The national dance of New Zealand is the haka (Maori: haka), a ritual dance of the Maori people, combining singing, powerful body movements, chest and hip blows, shouts and expressive grimaces (eyes, tongue), symbolizing strength, unity, determination and memory of ancestors.

Key aspects of the haka:

Origin: Performed by Maori warriors before battle to intimidate the enemy, but later also used for peaceful purposes (meeting guests, weddings, funerals).

Varieties: There are different versions: men's (combat, with elements of aggression) and women's (calmer, such as the "poi" dance with balls), as well as options for the army and festivals.

Performance: This is a collective composition, where each element (arms, legs, body, eyes, tongue) plays its part; grimaces, shouts and stomping of the feet are important.

Meaning: A symbol of Maori strength, unity, pride and identity, which has become the calling card of all of New Zealand

Shamrock is the English name for the shamrock, a symbol of Ireland, which is a graphic representation of a three-leaf clover, most often white (*Trifolium repens*) or doubtful (*Trifolium dubium*). It is a symbol of St. Patrick's Day, associated with Irish culture, and has the meaning of both the Christian Trinity and freedom and good luck. Difference from four-leaf clover: It is important to distinguish the shamrock from the four-leaf clover (four-leaf clover), which is a commonly accepted symbol of good luck, while the shamrock is a specific symbol of Ireland.



Giant's Causeway, County Antrim



The Giant's Causeway is an area of basalt rock in the shape of tall hexagonal columns on the north coast of Northern Ireland. The fascinating hexagon shapes of the columns were created millions of years ago when lots of volcanoes were erupting. As the lava cooled quickly, it contracted and cracked into the shape of hexagons.



King John's Castle, Limerick




King John's Castle was built over 800 years ago to protect the city of Limerick from attacks. The way it was constructed was very advanced for its time. It has thick walls made of limestone, corner towers to defend the castle and a drawbridge and gatehouse to stop people coming in who were not welcome.

Cliffs of Moher, County Clare



The Cliffs of Moher are huge sea cliffs on the west coast of Ireland. They rise up to 214 metres which is taller than a 60-story building! They also stretch 5 miles along the Atlantic Ocean. The Cliffs of Moher are a bird paradise. Over 20 different types of seabirds live there, including puffins, razorbills and gulls. In spring and summer, thousands of birds nest on the ledges of the cliffs. You may also see dolphins, seals and even basking sharks swimming in the water below the cliffs!
